The Regional HHW Collection Program provides members with convenient access to proper HHW disposal. If you live in a participating community, you may take HHW products to the permanent collection facilities in Kansas City, Missouri, and Lee's Summit, Missouri, free of charge. You may also attend **ANY** of the mobile collections held throughout the year. **Proof of residency is required.**

## Tips for gathering your HHW for safe disposal



- Seal containers tightly.
- Bring items in their original containers inside a sturdy box.
- If original container is leaking or damaged, transfer product to a safe container and re-label.
- Don't mix products together.
- Be prepared to leave your containers. Containers such as gasoline cans will not be returned at mobile events.

Open April - November: First Saturday of each month, 7 a.m.–noon; Third Wednesday of each month, 2–6 p.m. (Paint, batteries, oil, antifreeze and fluorescent bulbs only). 100-pound limit per visit.
WHO	No charge for residents of cities and counties participating in the Regional HHW Collection Program. <b>Must bring ID with proof of residency.</b> <i>Must be a member of a participating community.</i>	
ACCEPTS	Automotive products, antifreeze, batteries, CFL light bulbs, fertilizers, flammables, fuels, hazardous cleaners, hazardous liquids, household cleaners, lawn and garden products, paint, pesticides, photographic chemicals, pool chemicals, solvents, thinners, used oil.	
DOES NOT ACCEPT	Prescription drugs, electronics, explosives, yard waste, commercial waste, pressurized gas cylinders, items containing asbestos, tires, appliances.

## To bin, or not to bin? Now there's no question!

Knowing what to recycle curbside and what to toss in the garbage is not always easy. To ease confusion, the MARC Solid Waste Management District created the “**Recycle More, Recycle Better**” guide, which lists the most up-to-date information on what can and can't go in your curbside recycling bin. The top half of the poster illustrates recyclable materials that you can toss in your curbside recycling bin. The bottom half shows materials that should NOT go in your bin, and offers alternative ways to recycle many of those products.
